

Monty Hunter Fundraiser

Last week, the Board voted at the regular Club meeting to cosponsor a fundraiser for longtime Dunsmuir area resident Monty Hunter. A couple of days prior to the meeting Heather Curtin, Director of the McLeod Community Resource Center, telling him that Monty Hunter had been diagnosed with 4th stage pancreatic cancer. Monty's friends including Ray Kellar met after learning of the diagnosis to discuss putting on a fundraiser. They contacted Will to see if our Club would co-sponsor the event and be responsible for obtaining the ABC license. After the Board approval and concurrence of Club members in attendance, Will made the license application. The license is in hand.

The fundraising dinner is Saturday, February 28, from 6 to 9 pm at the Dunsmuir Community Building. The dinner features tritip barbecued by Robert Wallace, side dishes prepared by Monty's friends, a no-host wine bar (our participation), a live auction, a dessert auction, and a raffle. The Board also voted to cover the cost of the ABC license and an additional \$150 to help with expenses.

The Club now needs help in two ways. First, we will need a Club member present to "tend bar" —not a difficult take when pouring wine. We also need a member who can distribute posters down town. Will is going to pass around a simple sign up sheet at this week's meeting. He will also have the posters to distribute.

If you don't know Monty, you might know his grandson Randy Hicks who graduated from DHS in 2014. Randy was the kicker and a running back for the DHS football team and a member of the DHS/MHS wrestling team. Monty and his wife raised Randy for many years.


New Storage for Dunsmuir Rotary?



Fun This Weekend for the Art-Inclined
